

BRITISH RADIOFREQUENCY SPECTROSCOPY GROUP.

The British Radiofrequency Spectroscopy Group came into being at a Conference held in the Physics Department, University College of N.Wales, Bangor. This Conference which dealt with several topics in Radiofrequency Spectroscopy was organised by Professor E.R. Andrew, at the suggestion of Institute of Physics.

During this Conference a meeting of all those attending was held to discuss the possibility of forming a permanent "Radiofrequency Spectroscopy Group". It was decided that this would be very welcome, and the meeting elected eight persons to form a Committee and plan future meetings, and deal with other matters affecting the Group. The Group was not affiliated to any other Institute or Society initially, although it was felt that the Institute of Physics and the Physical Society should be kept fully informed of the arrangements made by the Group.
